Background

The Midwest Deer and Wild Turkey Study Group (MDWTSG) meeting is an annual gathering of wildlife managers sanctioned by and affiliated with the Midwest Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies. Primary objectives of the meeting include dissemination of deer and wild turkey management strategies, discussion of emerging or existing issues associated with deer and wild turkey management, and coordination of regional deer and wild turkey management or research efforts. The meeting location rotates among the Midwestern states that are active within the group. Forums such as the MDWTSG meeting provide valuable opportunities for state deer and turkey biologists to become acquainted with emerging issues and exchange information and ideas related to deer and turkey research and management. The need for state fish and wildlife agencies to establish and maintain deer and turkey biologist positions and support travel of these biologists to the annual MDWTSG meeting is imperative for exchanging information to promote quality wildlife management and research in each state. It is more important than ever that state agencies are at the forefront of issues related to deer and turkey management to protect the heritage and recreational opportunities of hunting for future sportsmen and sportswomen.

Meeting Time and Place

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department (NDGF) hosted the 2023 MDWTSG meeting at the Rough Riders Hotel in Medora, North Dakota on September 25-28. The MDWTSG appreciates the financial support provided by the National Wild Turkey Federation (NWTF) and the National Deer Association (NDA) and logistical and editorial support provided by Charlie Bahnson, Kristi Fast, Alegra Powers, and Dale Repnow, Mason Ryckman and Stephanie Tucker (NDGF). Registration and financial management of funds was provided by Hannah Edens and Alex Rischette (North Dakota Chapter of The Wildlife Society).

Executive Summary

The theme of the Midwest Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (MAFWA) directors meeting in Green Bay this summer was "Collaboration Between Agencies". Tiering off of the collaboration theme, the opening talks on Tuesday morning session focused on how working groups within MAFWA could collaborate more on joint projects. Representative from the Wildlife Health Committee, Private Lands Program, Upland Game Bird Groups, and interstate collaboration on management of chronic wasting disease outlined several potential opportunities for future collaborative projects. During later sessions the deer and turkey representatives met separately to discuss current research efforts and other topics such as methodology for capture and monitoring of turkey, and the use of Infrared technology to survey big game. State reports were given to the respective groups in the afternoon, followed by general discussions. On Wednesday, NWTF and NDA updates were given by Clayton Lenk and Matt Ross, respectively. In the deer group presentations were given evaluating telemetry equipment, surveying archery hunting pressure, and deer-vehicle collisions. The turkey biologists held an open forum discussion on future research topics. During the afternoon a joint field trip toured Theodore National Park and the North Dakota Cowboy Hall of Fame.

Following this introduction, Casey Anderson, Wildlife Division Chief (NDGF) welcomed the group to North Dakota. Casey acknowledged the shared challenges all state agencies share and urged the groups to

work together to seek solutions. On Wednesday morning Joe Weigand, a premiere Theodore Roosevelt interpreter and historian, entertained the group with the conservation role TR played in each state. We hope all attendees enjoyed their stay in North Dakota.

Medora North Dakota - Medora is a small western North Dakota town with a year-round resident population of approximately 120 people. Medora serves as the gateway to the south unit of Theodore Roosevelt National Park (TRNP). TRNP encompasses more than 70,000 acres of rugged badlands and home to bison, deer, prairie dogs, and more than 185 species of birds. During the summer Medora hosts a musical, 18-hole golf course and numerous tourist attractions. In 2026 The Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library will open in Medora. Come visit!
